INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE ON ENHANCING ARTSCIENCE IN THE AGE OF SUSTAINABILITY (ICASAS'24)

Artsience is about knowing, analysing, experiencing and feeling simultaneously. More recently and especially in light of the unsustainability crisis dominating the global scenario as underlined by the current imperatives of Planetary Health and Climate Change, the Artsience movement is now gaining momentum with the aim of ensuring that the intuitive, imaginative methods of the “Art” and the rational rule-oriented methods of Science, are brought together again. In other words, in the context of the search for solutions for today's needs, the focus of science to seek an understanding that is objective and unambiguous and the focus of Art on an understanding that is unique, and that are based on open-ended subjective experiences, need to be harmonised and harnessed.

On the 12th & 13th June 2024, the Universiti Malaya Centre for Civilisational Dialogue (UMCCD), Institute for Advanced Studies (IAS), Universiti Malaya, Azman Hashim Chair of Music Universiti Malaya and Universiti Malaya UNESCO Club (UMUC) jointly organised an **International Conference on Enhancing ArtScience in the Age of Sustainability (ICASAS'24)**.

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INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE ON ENHANCING ARTSCIENCE IN THE AGE OF SUSTAINABILITY (ICASAS'24)

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Sub-themes of the conference include: ArtScience for Achieving a More Complete and Universal Understanding of the Sustainability Imperative, ArtScience for Understanding Human Experience of Nature through the Synthesis of Scientific Exploration and Artistic Expressions, Teaching Art, Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics in an Integrated Manner, ArtScience for the Rehumanisation of all Knowledge.

The conference started with an introductory note by Emeritus Professor Datuk Dr. Azizan Baharuddin, Director, Universiti Malaya Centre for Civilisational Dialogue (UMCCD) followed by a welcoming speech by Professor Dr. Abrizah Abdullah, Dean, Institute for Advanced Studies (IAS) whilst Professor Dr. Yatimah Alias, Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic & International), Universiti Malaya officiated the ICASAS'24. Also present at the opening ceremony was Prof. Dr. Mohd Nasir Hashim, Dean, Faculty of Creative Arts and Holder of the Azman Hashim Chair of Music.

The conference featured several distinguished keynote speakers who are leaders in their respective fields. Among them were Emeritus Professor Dato' Dr. Osman Bakar, Al-Ghazali Chair of Epistemology and Civilizational Studies and Renewal, International Institute of Islamic Thought and Civilisation (ISTAC), International Islamic University Malaysia who spoke on "Restoring the Unity of the Arts and the Sciences: An Imperative for Malaysia Madani", Dr. Jillian Ooi Lean Sim from Department of Geography, Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences, Universiti Malaya who delivered on "Artsience for Understanding Human Experience of Nature through the Synthesis of Scientific Exploration and Artistic Expression", Associate Professor Dr. Mona El-Sherbini, Founding Director, Narrative Medicine and Planetary Health, Faculty of Medicine, University of Cairo, Egypt who presented on "Beyond Boundaries: The Anthropocene, Artsience and the Quest for Planetary Health, Emeritus Professor Dr. Azirah Hashim who focused on "Global Challenges: The Role of the Social Sciences and Humanities". The moderator for both morning and evening sessions of Day 1 was Assoc. Prof. Dr. Durriyyah Sharifah Hasan Adli, Research Fellow, UMCCD.



On May 28, 2024, the Embassy of Azerbaijan in Malaysia hosted an official reception to commemorate the 106th anniversary of the declaration of Azerbaijan's Independence Day at the Mayang Sari Grand Ballroom, JW Marriott Hotel in Bukit Bintang, Kuala Lumpur. The Nanotechnology and Catalysis Research Center (NANOCAT), Water Warriors, Universiti Malaya Sustainable Development Centre (UMSDC), Monash University Malaysia and PJ Seed 5.0 Sustainable Community Project (lead by Mr. Chang

Lee Wei, UMCCD Senior Research officer) conducted the forum “Guarding Our Water Together” on the 8th June 2024, as part of the World Environment Day Symposium 2024, hosted by the UM Sustainable Development Centre (UMSDC) in collaboration with the Faculty of Science and sustainability partners. Moderated by Dr. Michelle Yap from Monash University Malaysia, the forum featured a panel of experts, including Dr. Faddrine Jang (Monash University Malaysia), Assoc. Prof. Dr. Nurhidayatullaili Muhd Julkapli (NANOCAT, UM), and Mr. Affan Nasaruddin (UMSDC & Water Warriors). Topics that were discussed include effective water management strategies, community involvement in conservation, innovations in sustainable water use, and the roles of academic institutions and sustainability initiatives in protecting water resources.

INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE ON RELIGIOUS TRADITIONS AND SUSTAINABILITY CULTURE



In an effort to foster communication and improve sociocultural ties throughout Asia, the UMCCD, in partnership with the **Japan Da'wah Centre, Osaka**, the Malaysian Green Technology and Climate Change Corporation (MGTC), and other universities, hosted the International Conference on Religious Traditions and Sustainability Culture on the 22nd & 23rd June 2024. Through meaningful dialogue on universal values, this initiative sought to strengthen socio-cultural linkages between Asian Muslim and Japanese populations, with a focus on religious traditions and sustainable cultural practices.

Esteemed speakers shared their knowledge, with keynote topics such as “Religious Traditions and Sustainability Culture” by Emeritus Prof. Datuk Dr. Azizan Baharuddin from UMCCD and “Muslim Cemeteries and Local Communities: Focusing on External Actors” by Dr. Yoshida Masahiro from **Osaka Metropolitan University**. Other presentations explored green mosque practices, leadership in sustainable mosque initiatives, and cross-religious perspectives on environmental conservation from Islamic and Shinto traditions, underscoring the value of integrating sustainable practices rooted in religious teachings into daily life. These included “Green Mosque Practices and Japanese Values” by Dr. Asmawati Muhamad, “Good Leadership Practices for Effective Green Mosque Implementation” by Associate Professor Dr. Siti Arni Basir, and “Green Mosque Implementation from The Prophetic Traditions” by Dr. Muhamad Alihanafiah Norasid from Universiti Malaya, “Shintoism and Islamic Civilization Worldview” by Madam Nadiah Abdul Rahman from Tunku Abdul Rahman University of Management and Technology, “The Role of Humanitarian Volunteers in Assisting The Community's Spirituality After Disaster (Case Study Muhammadiyah Disaster Management Center, Indonesia)” by Associate Professor Twediana Budi Hapsari from Universitas Muhammadiyah **Yogyakarta, Indonesia**, “Islam for Well-Being: Implications, Possibilities, and Ways Ahead from Cultural Perspectives” by Sensei Yusuf Morishita and “Harmony with Nature : Environmental Conservation in Islam and Shintoism” by Dr. Nur Fitriyana from **UIN Raden Fatah Palembang, Indonesia**. On the 6th August 2024, the Applied Science with Islamic Studies Programme, Academy of Islamic Studies and UMCCD co-organised the International Discourse on Islamic Science and Civilisation, held at the Academy of Islamic Studies, Universiti Malaya. The program was an intellectual platform that explored the profound contributions of Islamic science and civilisation to the development of human knowledge and culture. The topics presented by the invited speakers included Dr Osman Rasip on “First Graduate Programme, Academy of Islamic Studies, Universiti Malaya”, Dr. Mohd Hafiz Mohd Saadon on “Astronomy in Islam”, and Dr. Madiha Baharuddin on “Golden Age of Islam: Muslims Contributions in the History of Science and Technology”. Hajj Kyoichiro Sugimoto, Chairman of CHIBA Islamic Cultural Centre (CICC) also presented a speech at the program. This discourse fostered dialogue on how Islamic principles and values can address current global challenges, emphasising sustainability, innovation, and the ethical integration of science in diverse societies. This initiative served as a nexus for reviving the spirit of inquiry and collaboration that characterised the Islamic Golden Age.

INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE ON TRADITION AND RELIGIOUS STUDIES (IC-TIARS) "EXPLORING CONTEMPORARY MUSLIM RELIGIOUS EXPRESSIONS IN THE DIGITAL AGE"



The Faculty of Ushuluddin and Islamic Thought-UIN Raden Fatah Palembang hosted the third International Conference, IC-TiaRS III (The Third International Conference on Tradition and Religious Studies) on the 17th and 18th July 2024. The theme for IC-TiaRS III 2024 is "Exploring Contemporary Muslim Religious Expression in the Digital Age".

The first day of the conference began with the opening ceremony held at the Rafa Tower building, Campus A, UIN Raden Fatah, Palembang. The Deputy Chancellor III, Dr. Hj. Hamidah, officiated the 2024 International IC-TiaRS III seminar on behalf of UIN Chancellor Raden Fatah Palembang, Prof. Nyayu Khodijah. Following that, keynote speakers who were present in person or via Zoom Online presented the findings of their scientific work. Important international speakers were invited at this conference. Dr. Asmawati Muhamad from Universiti Malaya represented **Malaysia**, Dr. Abdulloh Mama from Ma'had Tarbiyah, High Institute for Islamic Education, **Thailand**, and Dr. Imam Malik Riduan represented **Australia**. Dr. Rachmat Baihaky from UIN Syarif Hidayatullah **Jakarta**, together with three additional keynote speakers from UIN Raden Fatah Palembang, including Dr. Nurfitriyana, Dr. Arpah Nurhayat dan Dr. Apriyanti also presented at the IC-TiaRS.

Dr. Asmawati Muhamad, UMCCD Deputy Director, was the first keynote speaker with her work entitled "Transformational Sustainability Leadership in The Digital Age". She explained about how leaders today use digital tools to promote sustainable practices and solve environmental and social challenges. This approach encourages a culture of learning and teamwork through digital platforms, helping leaders inspire change and build a sustainable future.

SPECIAL PUBLIC LECTURE

"ISLAM FOR SUSTAINABILITY AND WELL-BEING: A CIVILISATIONAL DIALOGUE"

On the 12th August 2024, UMCCD organised a special public lecture entitled "Islam for Sustainability and Well-being: A Civilisational Dialogue". The lecture was presented by Professor Dr. Yusuf Morishita, Sociologist Fellow/ Collaborator from Hokkaido University, Japan. The presentation explored on how Islam relates and contributes to, and potentially enhances sustainability in Japan's social environment through sociological and cultural perspectives, focusing on SDG3 (good health and well-being), SDG11 (sustainable cities and communities), and SDG17 (partnerships for the goals).

According to Prof. Dr. Yusuf Morishita, Japan, often associated with values such as respect, harmony, dedication, and cleanliness, faces issues of loneliness severe enough to warrant the appointment of a minister in 2022. He explained that the Islamic concept of *Ummah*, a type of inclusive community similar to *gemeinschaft*, offers traits like borderlessness, inclusivity, and quality social bonds, which could help address Japan's loneliness issues and foster well-being. Non-Muslim Japanese visitors to mosques, for example, often find comfort and connection there, illustrating how spiritual well-being supports physical and mental health.

His discussion also addressed the expansion of the Islamic Ummah in Japan and the role of individual Muslims in contributing to harmonious communities. Challenges however, arise, such as negative opinions by non-Muslims based on contact with some Muslims. It is suggested that by embodying Islamic principles and practicing respect and integration with Japanese standards, Muslims can contribute to a more harmonious, inclusive community, benefiting both Muslims and non-Muslims. Sustainability here refers to not just maintaining well-being but also facilitating growth via shared ideals and mutual respect, ensuring that communities thrive. The lecture ended with a Q&A session, followed by a photography session with the participants.

7TH WORLD CONFERENCE ON ISLAMIC THOUGHT & CIVILIZATION (WCIT 2024)

The 7th World Conference on Islamic Thought & Civilization (WCIT 2024) was held from 29th to 31st July 2024 at the Casuarina Convention Centre in Ipoh, Perak, Malaysia, under the theme “Together We Stand: Muslims and Global Humanity.” The World Conference on Islamic Thought & Civilization (WCIT) is a Perak State event, and has been organised by **Universiti Sultan Azlan Shah (USAS)** since 2012, with participants coming from more than 21 countries. The event featured a Special Address by **YAB Dato’ Seri Anwar Ibrahim, Prime Minister of Malaysia**, followed by a Royal Keynote Address by **Duli Yang Maha Mulia Paduka Seri Sultan Perak Darul Ridzuan Sultan Nazrin Muizzuddin Shah**. A **Distinguished Royal Session** also took place, with prominent speakers including H.E. Dr. Jusuf Kalla, H.E. Dr. Naledi Pandor, H.E. Mr. George Yeo, Prof. Fawaz A. Gerges, and moderated by Dato’ Dr. Afifi Al-Akiti, on the same day. **WCIT 2024** offered a valuable platform for advancing Islamic thought and civilisation within the framework of global humanity.

UMCCD Director, Emeritus Prof. Datuk Dr. Azizan Baharuddin, was invited as a guest speaker for Session VII “Green Technology and Environmental Sustainability”. Together with her on the stage were Prof. Dr. Tariqullah Khan (Professor of Islamic Economics & Finance, INCEIF University) and Ms. Charlotte Wolf-Bye (Vice President Chief Sustainability Officer PETRONAS). The session was moderated by Dr. Heazar Ismail (Acting Group CEO, UiTM Holdings Sdn Bhd). In her presentation, Prof. Azizan emphasised on several keypoints which include the critical importance of the topic today - current state of our earthly home, the reality of the Anthropocene, sustainability is not a choice for humans’ and planet’s survival, Islamic Declaration for Climate Change (2015), Interfaith Declaration of Stockholm+50 conference (2022), Al-Mizan Covenant for the Earth (2024), Laodato Si’, Laodate Deum, Malaysia’s National Planetary Health Action Plan (2023-2024), examples of practical initiatives and efforts by religious groups, transformational sustainability leadership - An imperative, and Bringing science (knowledge and values) together.

Other sessions included topics on education and research, global politics, economic cooperation and development, the rule of law, governance and integrity, and art and humanity. The 7th WCIT was more than a conference; it was a catalyst for change, a place where people connected through a shared hope for a world where Islamic values can contribute to justice, compassion, and progress across cultures and nations.

This event was part of the Sapphire Jubilee Celebration of the Faculty of Science. The program that involved 40 participants with learning disabilities from Semenyih, Selangor, included a knowledge-sharing session about mental education and social challenges, led by Mr. Firdaus from the Disabled Counseling and Empowerment Unit, along with Ms. Syafawati Abd Haris and her mother, Mrs. Mazni Muhammad, a disabled student from the Faculty of Science. There were also interactive science experiments conducted by members of the Association of Laboratory Technologists of the University of Malaya (PJMUM). Participants had the chance to explore several science exhibition galleries, including the Marine and Freshwater Aquarium, Eureka Gallery, Path to the Realm of Science, I-Rays, and others. They also took part in science activities designed for the disabled, guided by volunteers from UMUC. 
